TITLE OF THE PAPER – INTRODUCTION TO JOURNALISTIC THEORY AND PRACTICES


Course Objectives


TITLE OF THE PAPER -REPORTING


TITLE OF THE PAPER -5.1- MEDIA LAWS


TITLE OF THE PAPER -6.2- INTRODUCTION TO DIGITAL MEDIA
