Outcome: Volunteers learnt more on his contributions along with gaining knowledge on a better way to live, making it a memorable and an inspiring experience.

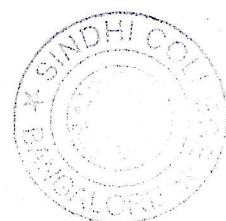
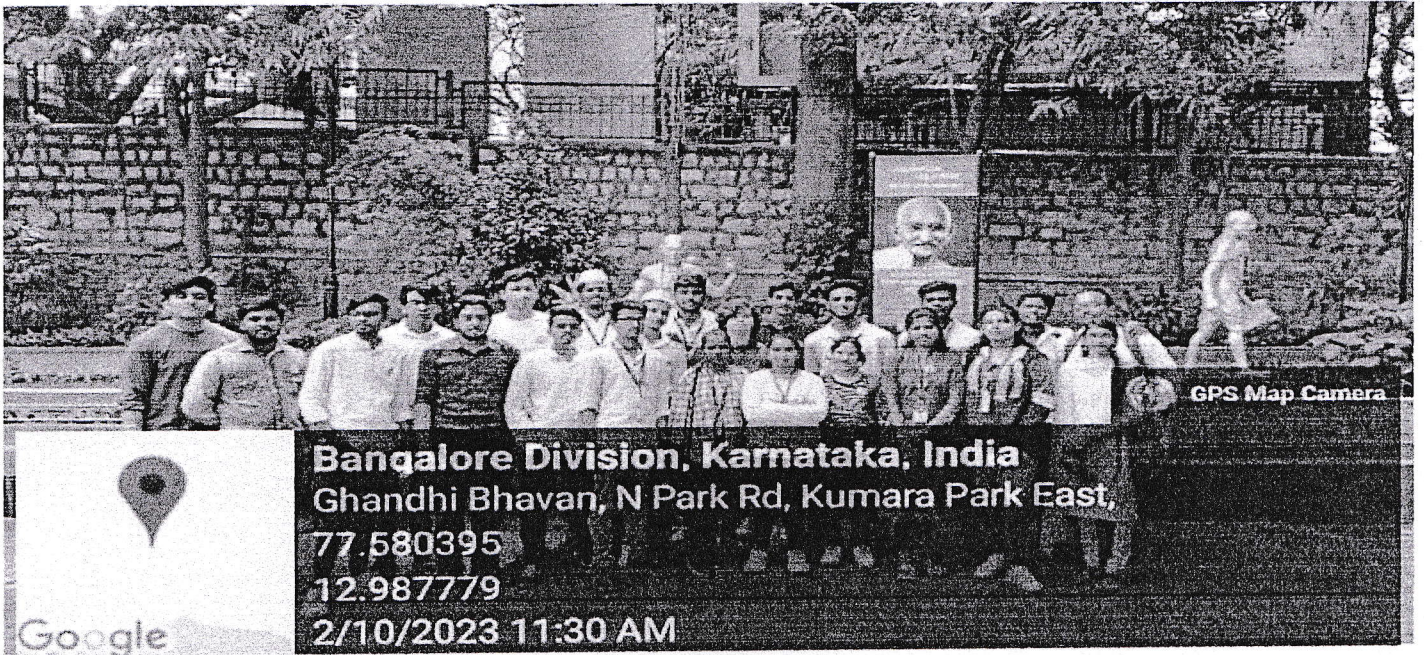

Sindhi College with Prof. M.A. Vaidyesh Leading the Charge"

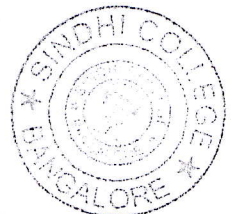

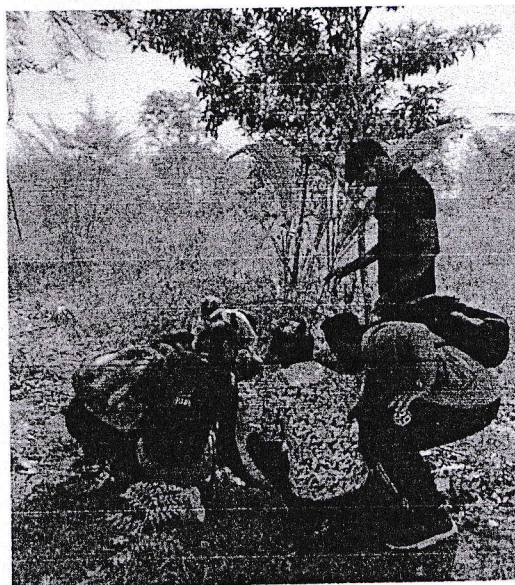
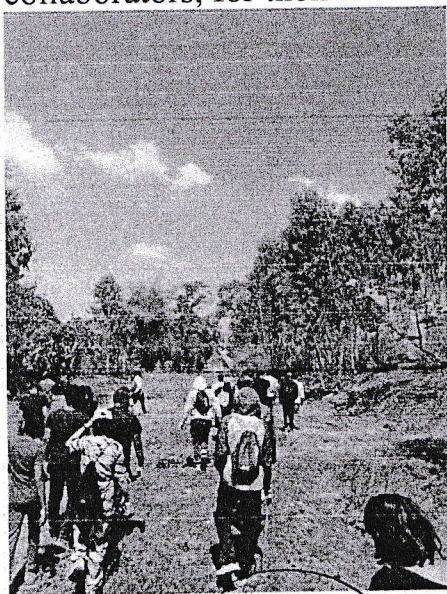
impacts of climate change and human activities on water resources. This experience prompted discussions on the importance of water conservation and the need for sustainable water management practices.

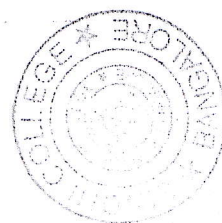

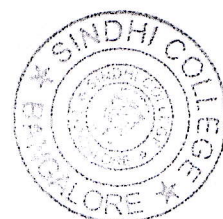

Overall, the event served as a testament to the power of collective action and community engagement in fostering a culture of democracy and active citizenship.

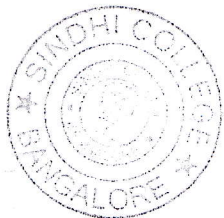
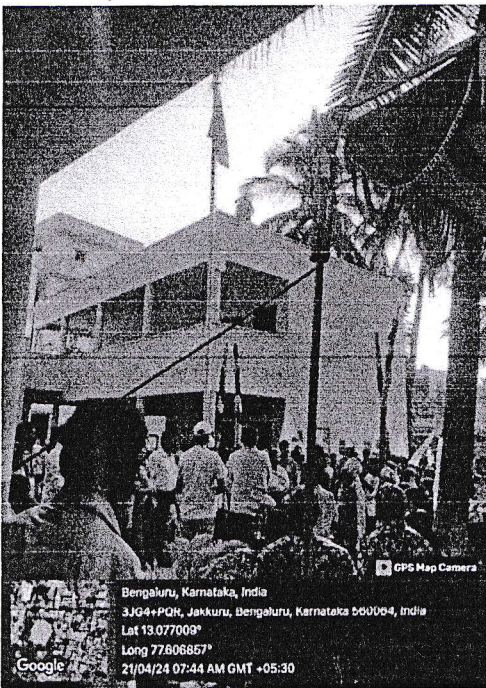
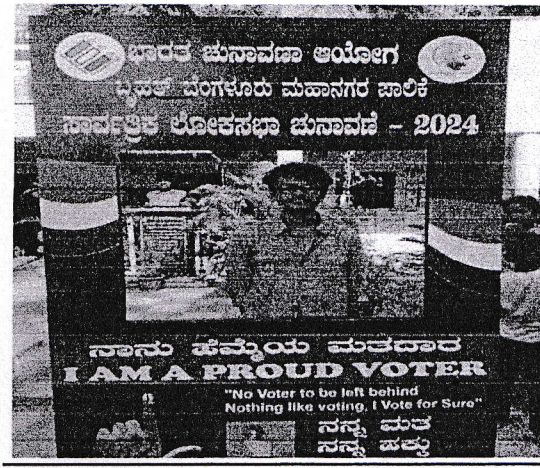
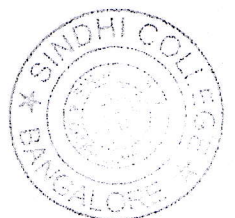

Overall, the event served as a testament to the power of collective action and community engagement in fostering a culture of democracy and active citizenship.

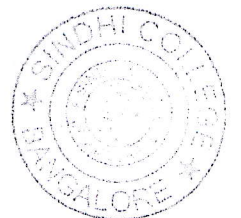
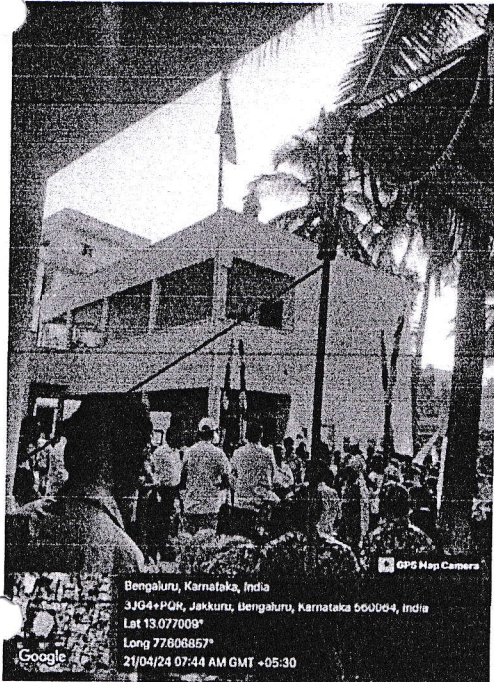
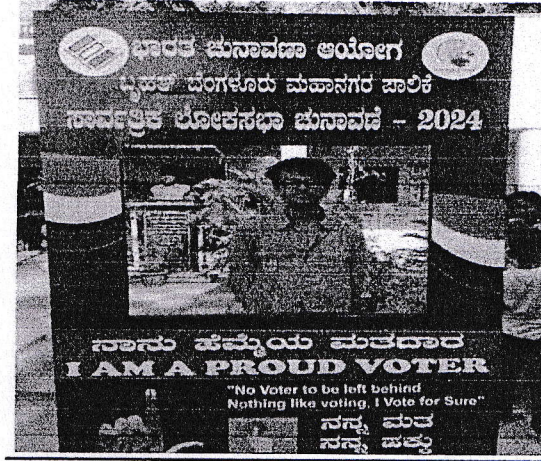
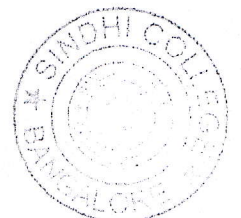

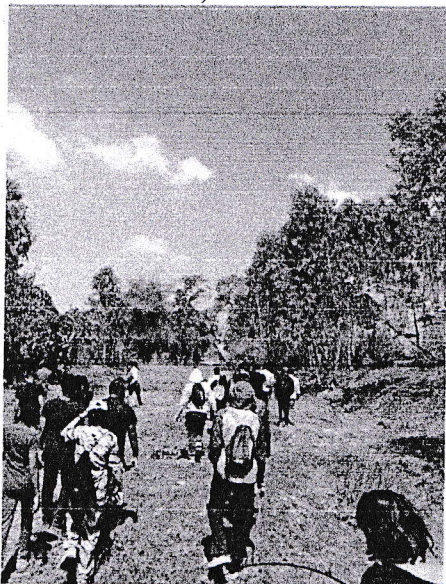
impacts of climate change and human activities on water resources. This experience prompted discussions on the importance of water conservation and the need for sustainable water management practices.

Outcome: Volunteers learnt more on his contributions along with gaining knowledge on a better way to live, making it a memorable and an inspiring experience.

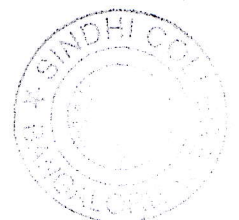


