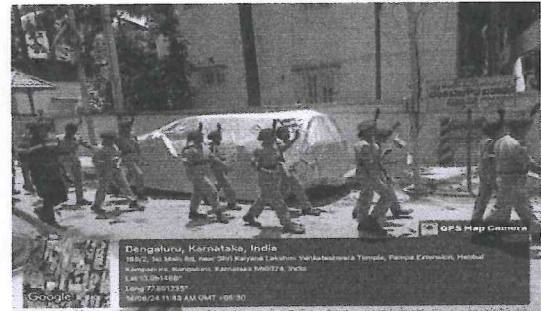

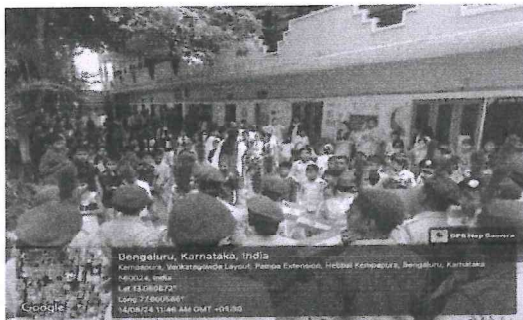
REPORT ON: HAR GHAR TIRANGA RALLY

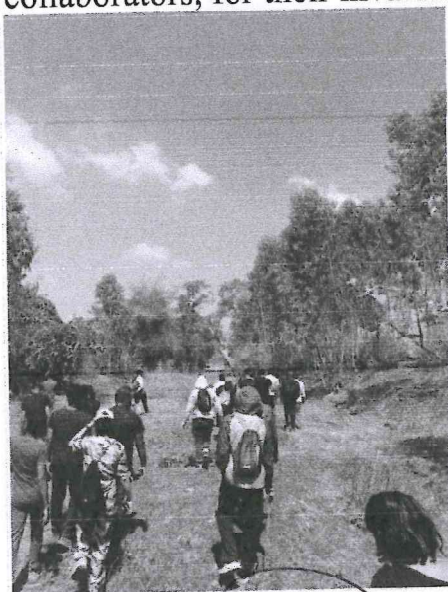
impacts of climate change and human activities on water resources. This experience prompted discussions on the importance of water conservation and the need for sustainable water management practices.

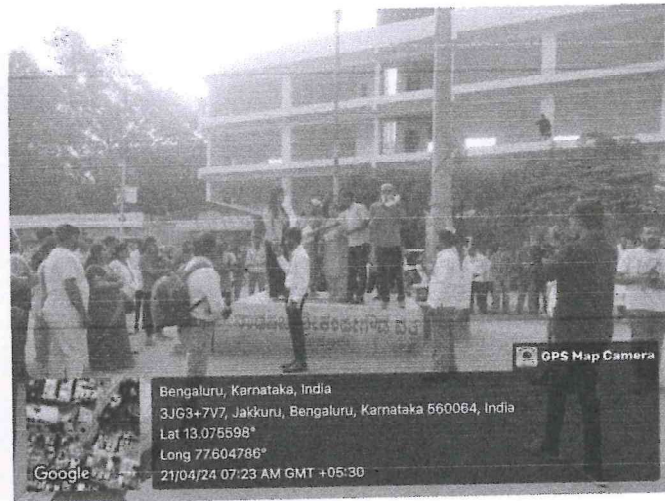
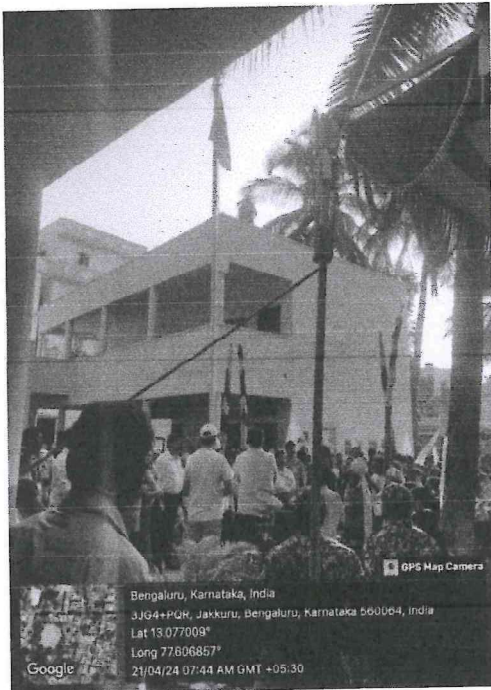
Conclusion:

After having dinner by 9 pm all team are gathered for the daily feedback. Where volunteers share the pros and cons of the day while working once again, and the problem they faced in that they motivated

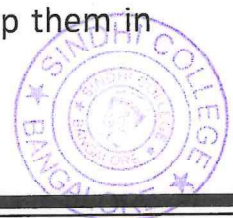
DAY 3 and 4
